4. Chairman's Comments and Report

RJ reported as follows:

- RJ has attended various meetings regarding Brexit.
- RJ attended a roundtable policing meeting with people attending from the Home Office and Police, looking at strategy for Brexit. There may be a paper which RJ will share.
- RJ also attended a meeting looking at traffic impacts.
- RJ confirmed the Port of Dover were very busy looking at infrastructure.

5. Update/discussion – Jo Rossi – Locate in Kent

JR gave a power point presentation relating to a project with KCC – Demand in Kent. JR confirmed she would share the slides with the group.

Demand for industrial/office space in East Kent

KH asked about supply in Kent and how long it had been on the website and how much available space was fit for purpose.

AC asked whether market research should be undertaken to give an accurate picture

JR confirmed that in Tunbridge Wells this had been undertaken by a surveyor.

The information JR was supplying was only demand that is coming through Locate in Kent.

JR reported there was a huge supply of office space available.

KH said that she felt the level of demand was potentially inaccurate as it was only what went through Locate in Kent and KH felt that Locate in Kent was not always used by local businesses.

Lauren Moore confirmed that there was range of office space up to 60,000 sq ft available at Discovery Park. JR said she would feed back to Locate in Kent about space available at Discovery Park. JR confirmed that demand is active projects they have only and not everyone that has registered with them.

JR said that the Locate in Kent Team meet regularly with Districts. They do a perception study every 2/3 years to see what draws people to Kent/Districts.
